From Dec. 2012 to May 2015, the PRO AKIS project (Prospects for farmers' support: Advisory Services in the European Agricultural Knowledge and Information Systems), has developed a conceptual framework for assessing AKIS, compiled an inventory of AKIS institutions and interactions in the EU-27 as a searchable database and detailed reports.
